## **From Disputation to Understanding: A Pastor and a Rabbi Speak About The Role of the Messiah**

Parsons is an author, attorney, journalist, ordained minister and Middle East specialist who has served for over 20 years with the International Christian Embassy Jerusalem, currently as Vice President & Senior Spokesman. He is a leading Christian pro-Israel advocate on both theological and geo-strategic issues. His new book Floodgates (Whitaker House Publishing) examines the Flood of Noah as a complete analogy for the 'End of Days,' as taught by Jesus and the Apostles.*

*Rabbi Emanuel Gentilcore studied philosophy and religion at Florida State University. After graduation, he studied and eventually taught at Yeshiva Ohr Somayach and was awarded his second rabbinic ordination from the former chief Rabbi of Jerusalem in 1997. As the director of VISA (Visiting Israel Students Association) for 15 years, he provided extra-curricular educational programs for overseas students at the Rothberg International School of the Hebrew University. Today, Rabbi Gentilcore researches topics about the Messiah and engages in dialogues with Christians and Messianic Jews, in addition to being a certified Reality Therapist and Torah Life Coach.*
