Gross, an aggressive missionary woman of the Messianic sect, in addition to missionary publications in Yiddish, Manglish and Hebrew and New Testaments. Rabbis have approached the office of the "Yad L'Akhim" organization in Jerusalem after many packages were left in postal branches, asking that the public be notified to destroy the material and that the public not be caused to stumble by reading it. There have also been appeals from workers in various branches of the post office in Jerusalem where their branches are filled with this material, and "Yad L'Akhim" calls on the public to convey all missionary material which will be destroyed in a central action as part of a project of "Burning the Legven." END

Father (sic!) Lindsey, who heads the church, went out into the well-cared-for yard, and saw that the glass door had been smashed to bits by a stone shot. On the 5th of January this year unknown persons threw a large stone on the newly-repaired door and smashed it. On the 21st January again they were gathering up the pieces at the Baptist Church. On the 22nd of January the door was smashed another time.

"Teddy Kollek has shown an attitude of understanding and good will. All the damages have been p aid for by the Municipality, and now we have sent an additional bill. He has been very generous," says Margaret Lindsey, the wife of the head of the Baptist congregation, and expresses astonishment: "For years there have been no incidents, but recently a wave of harassments suddenly (NOME)

began. Last month there was also a break in at our book warehouse. Drawers were opened and piles of books were overturned. Beside the prayer room of the small church there is a display room of Christian scriptures and various Protestant publications. It was these which apparently aroused the ire of the unknown attackers.

"They were also at our place," says David B. of Georgia, the volunteer manager of the book shop, "The Torch" on Shlomtsion Street. Last month the shop, which belong to a Protestant organization "Kehilat Ha'Shem" ("Assembly of God") with headquarters in the U.S.A., was attacked. A large stone was hurled at the show window, and following that rags dipped in benzene were thrown in. The arson attempt was unsuccessful, and the damages were paid by the Municipality, but among Christian institutions, especially in West Jerusalem, the apprehension/that some organization had undertaken a frontal attack against institutions promulgating Christian missionary literature.

"Generally, there is a tendency to mix" to the term 'missionaries' a significance which does not reflect our real activity," says Charles Kopp, who heads the book shop and the Protestant organization called "Zion House." "We are missionaries, and it is our duty as such to spread the Gospel, but we don't deal in propositions for travel tickets, or in giving gifts or enticements to people. The shop is open to those who wish to enter and to look over the publications we have." In recent weeks slogans have been painted a number of times on the front of "Zion House" on Prophets Street: "Dirty Dogs, Bisodsuckers, Get out of the Country." Kopp also praises the Municipality for its handling of the situation: "We have found understanding and consideration in the Mayor," he says.

Who stands behind the campaign against the missionaries? This the police would also like to know, and according to their investigators several of the vandals among those who have recently attacked/ C_h ristian institutions are in their hands. One of them was hospitalized in a mental hospital, but the rest of them are nothing more than J_e wich nationalist extremists, or such as belong to the antimission fighters, among them the ultra-orthodox.

A number of rabbis have denounced the attacks on Christian religious institutions lately, and even published notices in the press to that effect. In one such it was stated: "These are the deeds of hooligans. Every one has the freedom to believe in God according to his faith, and it is inconceivable that in the Diaspora a Jewshould be attacked for praying to G-d." However, the activists of "Yad L'Akhim" are of a different opinion. They indeed refuse to justify violent acts against non-Jewish institutions, but the Secretary of the organization, Moshe Paruch, also would not agree in conversation with our correspondent to express reservations about these deeds: "We do not express reservations about deeds for which we are not responsible," he said.

What is the "Yad L'Akhim" organization, which has of late been publishing throughout the city propaganda against the activists of the Mission, which publishes a journal by name of "B'Maavak" ("In the Struggle") through its department for the struggle against the Mission of the activists of the Torah camp in Israel, "Yad L'Akhim", and which openly works to destroy: Christian Holy Scriptures? The assistant to the head of the department for the struggle against the Mission, Efraim Ben-Aharon, presents the air of this organization as one of its fundamentals. The secretary of "Yad L'Akhim", Moshe Porush, claims otherwise: "We set up "Yad L'Akhim" 30 years ago in order to promulgate our people's Torah among the new immigrants in Israel. The first were the Yemenite immigrants. It was there that we encountered for the first time missionary activity among rew immigrants, and we went out to fight this phenomenon." According to Porush, "Yad L'Akhim" does not only engage in the struggle against the Mission. "We work to spread the Torah, to educate for love of Israel, (MOME)

for the spiritual absorption of the new immigrants, by means of lectures in the neighbourhoods and in development towns, and by publication of Torah literature."

According to "Yad L'Akhim," there are at present working in Israel no less than about 7,000 missionaries, against whom only 300 activists of Yad L'Akhim are working at great self-sacrifice. Assimilation in Israel, and especially in Jerusalem, they say, will not be allowed. At the head of the organization is Rabbi Shalom Dov Lipschitz of Ramat Gan, and the activities are supported by contributions only. The attitude of the police to the organization is unclear: "If it is known to us that they are operating against the law, we will act," the say in the Jerusalem District. At the Municipality we were told that recently a senior figure in the Municipality paid a "visit" to the offices of the organization on Yona Street, No. 4, in Gaula, in order to learn what was doing there, "and we reported what we found to the police."

Well, are these the ones who have set fire to Christian religious institutions, breakers of church windows, painters in black on their walls and insulting clergy? To this the police have no answer. Nevertheless, it is clear that at least three additional EXECUTE are partners to the acts of vandalism directed against what is termed "the missionaries:" Activists of an extremmst rightwing organization, whose leader was even recently imprisoned, a group of ultra-orthodox from Meah Shearim which publicly notified its intention to fight a last-ditch battle against anyone who destroyed one soul in Israel by conversion to Christianity, and a group of eccentrics who for the most part work alone, with every one of them responsible usually for an attack on only one Christian institution.

One who reacted with great earnestness to the attacks upon Christian religious institutions in Jerusalem was Mayor Teddy Kollek. He even appealed to the Prime Minister, Menahem Begin, to make a public appeal to the vandals that they cease from their deeds for the sake of religious liberty in the capital. The Municipal spokesman Rafi Lebra says: "We pressed for a strong reaction on the part of the Prime Minister and the Chief Rabbis. First of all, this involves acts that the Jewish spirit of tolerance abhors. Secondly, the matter is causing incalculable damage to the State of Israel and to United Jerusalem." The municipal spokesman explained further in a press release that every stone cast at a church or every personal attack upon a clergyman means giving ammunition to antisemites and enemies of United Jerusalem in creating an uproar in the world in opposition to Jewish rule in the city. "During 13 years we displayed a generous attitude vis-à-vis the rights of the various communities, which has brought us sympathy and positive responses throughout the world. Now, all these petty acts of recent months are wiping out the achievements we have made, and those tiny groups, who are absolutely unbalanced, claim that every church is a mission, and they are destroying what we have built up in the course of a dozen years," the spokesman says.

It appears, however, that the activities of the police, the increase of patrols and the setting of ambushes in areas of Christian institutions, the reaction of the municipality, the denunciations of public figures from all sectors, are none of them making any special impression among those who are working against the Christians in Jerusalem, and they continue their activity and even promise future activity. Only Monday this week some young people attacked the Christian monastery nea: the well in Ein Karem, made fun of the monks, which required the intervention of the police. Next week the activists of "Yad L'Akhim" are planning to set afire hundreds of Christian Holy Scriptures, among them the 'acks of the "New Testament." The bookburning is planned in the framework of a public "burning of the leaven."

The municipal spokesman responded to this, as follows: "All that is left to us is to ask the same public in Jerusalem and Israel to express its loathing of such acts which remind the world of those shocking acts such as the night of the book burning of Jewish books in Germany. This is a vile act which is inconceivably damaging, and the reverberations of it are limble to cause us much damage."

Last month's issue of the "Yad L'Akhim" organ published a list of the missionry activities in Jerusalem neighbourhoods—in Ramot Sharat, Neve Yaacov, East Talpiot, French Hil., and in Ramot. It may be that there is indeed missionary activity in Jerusalem, and that—as this Torah organization claims—missionary tracts are being sent to rabbis, to physicians, and to the rest of the common people. We cannot deny the validity of a struggle against this phenomenon, but the question remains—without of course determining or suspecting that the "Yad L'Akhim" are violent (and it would appear that they are not such)—will the way of violence bring success to the campaign against missionaries, or will Jerusalem thereby lose its right to boast of heligious freedom it grants to the believers of the three religions for whom the city is sacred? QUOTE: A religious body called "The Torah Camp "Yad L'Akhim" has decided to bring joy to our heart with the coming of the Passover Feast in the framework of the "burning of the leaven" which will take place on the evening of

the festival when the a ctivists of the "camp" will cast into the fire "missionary lit erature." They even call on everyone who has in his possession such material to send it to them "in order to intensify the bonfire." In a photograph published in the press we can see clearly that among the "missionary material" are the books of the New Testament. The New Testament, as is well known, is the Book of Books of the Christian religion. The photograph was published, and there is no reaction.

Historical memory is at times a characteristic that one may forego since it does not bring great pleasure to its possessor. The joyous plan of the Yad L'Akhim activists is like the blinking of an eye connected in my memory to other bookburnings in the course of history. First of all, I could not avoid pondering on a certain regime whose book foci provided well-liked points for burning "undesirable material" even before it conceived the plan for burning human . beings. The "prohibited" literature that went up in flames in the Third Reich included the best of . thinkers and creators in Germany, a significant part of them Jewish.

What Christianity did to us in the course of our history is among the m ost well-known. Among other things, faithful Christians not only beset the physical lives of the Jews, but also their spiritual lives. In the Middle Ages, for example, there were from time to time "trials" of Jewish Holy Scriptures, and the Talmud was an especially acceptable subject. In one famous "trial", conducted on orders of Louis IX, King of France, the Jews were accused for the Talmud's containing blasphemous remarks about Jesus, and for pouring forth hatred for the faith of the Christians. To no avail were the arguments of the four rabbis who represented Judaism. The Talmud was "convicted", and in the year 1242 C.E., on order of the king, 24 wagon loads filled with Talmudic and other books were carried into one of the streets of Paris and set afire. Two young men, one from Provence, and the second from Germany, Rabbi Avraham Bedarshi and Rabbi Meir of Rottenberg, composed lamentations over the Talmud burning, and the devout fasted each year on the anniversary of the event. This was of course not the only incident of setting afire Jewish books. Those were dark days, hard days, days of blind/fanaticism.

Missionaries are not, as the English would say, "my cup of tea", whatever their faith may be. But I am a member of a people for whom the written word is one of its fundamental attributes. The historian Ben-Sasson wrote in his book "History of the People of Israel in the Medieval Era" that "books were admired and respected throughout all the Jewish Diaspora in the period we are discussing," and he added, that "the pious Askenazim preached an attitude of special sanctity for books." That was in the Middle Ages. But in the new Middle Ages, which groups like "Ead L'Akhim" seek to bring upon us, bookburning is a joyful adormment to the Festival of our Freedom. In recent years we are witnesses to an increase of zealotry in the State of Israel, a fanaticism with clearly religious symptoms. The illegitimate festivity

which is about to be celebrated in the coming days, an orgy of fire and smoke, will constitute an additional feather in the cap of narrow-mindedness and intolerance. END ARTICLE

Rabbi Saulsom notes in his message that on Collins Street in that city, near the Hotel Carbian, the sect "Ayin Zayin" (probably "Jehovah Witnesses"...TRANSL.) has located itself, and as he has been informed, many of the children of Israel have been trapped in their net. He calls on them to arouse public opinion by every means possible in order to stem this grave breach, while expressing hope that the ultra-orthodox public throughout the USA will lend a hand to assist in the purging out of this plague.

In a further appeal to Rabbi Moshe Sharar, the President of Agudat Yisrael in the USA, and Chairman of the World Steering Committee, Rabbi Saulson raises the matter and calls for the operation of every possible means at the disposal of the Agudat Yisrael in the USA in this matter. He writes in his letter: "While I was there, I saw with my own eyes the ruin and destruction—this sect of JW, which has located itself in the heart of town, is liable to bring upon innocent children of Israel," and he appeals to Rabbi Sherar to do everything possible to assist in the purging of this dreadful pestilence.

It should be noted that Rabbi Saulson has recently visited for several weeks throughout the USA, and in that framework he also visited Mjami Beach. When he arrived there, a number of ultra-orthodox functionaries locally appealed to him for aid in increases. -: against the sect which had set up shop in their city. END

Neither has the Ministry of Religious Affairs published an official demurrer from this shocking idea, which is reminiscent of the burning of the Talmud in the Middle Ages and the bookburnings of the Nazis. The officials of the Ministry made inquiry of "Yad L'Akhim", which is supported by the Ministry in its activities, at the request of the General Scretary of the Interfaith Committee, Yosef Emmanuel. The Mayor, a Likud party member who is supported by the NRP [National Religious Party], asked Maoz if it would not be better if they moved to Nes Tsiona. According to what Maos told me yesterday, threats of bombings were made by telephone to him and to the owners (of the store where the congregation meets) and where it worships on Sabbathsand Tuesdays. Maoz expressed his appreciation for the serious manner in which the police of Rishon Letsion have handled the matter. END (TRANS. QUOTE: A most disturbing phenomenon has come up with the announcement of some two weeks ago by the organization called "Yad L'Akhim" regarding its intention of burning missionary publications. The burning is to be kindled on Passover Eve in the framework of the "burning (or purging) of the leaven". The activists of the organization, so it is stated, will set after missionary literature, and for this purpose they have even made an appeal to the citizenry to send them such material, if it is in their possession, in order to magnify the bonfire. Although we do not seek logical reasons among those who are so enthusiastic to play with this kind of fire, it is hard for us to understand why they want to engage in it precisely as part of the leaven ceremony. Leaven is good and kosher, as is known, throughout the year. It may be assumed that they do not intend to intimate that only during the days of Passover it is, in their opinion, forbidden to look through the writings of the Mission, whereas the balance of the year it is permitted.

The idea of book burning has nothing whatever to do with the spirit of Judaism. As far as is known, the destruction of literary creations by this means was first accomplished in China in the year 213 B.C.E. At that time there arose a new emperor in the land who sought to introduce political and social changes and was of the opinion that the people must be severed from past tradition. To achieve this end he ordered, among other things, the burning of Chinese classics, and especially those which were of the teachings of Confucius. Since then, that emperor has been an object of derision for the sages of China of all generations.

There are those who connect the destruction of the famous Alexandrian library founded by King Ptolemy II in the 2nd Century BCE, and which contained apparently about 700,000 scrolls, to the Arabian commander Omar Ibn El-'Aaz, who conquered Alexandria in the middle of the 7th Century C.E. The claim is (notwithstanding conclusive evidence therefor) that he may the books, upon order of the Calif Omar, to the ovens of the many bathhouses in the city for six months. One version states that he said: "If there is nothing in them different from what is written in the Koran, then they are not needed; and if there is in them things which are contrary to the Koran, then they should be burned." (This he was said to have stated before deciding to consign the scrolls to the flames.)

The true perfecters of the "doctrine of burning"--in addition to the burning of human beings as well-were the leaders of the Catholic Church. This Church saw, and appa rently still sees, itself as obligated to protect men from the dangers lurking and which threaten his eternal salvation in t he reading of books which in its opinion are to be counted as heretical literature. The practical result was the maintenance of an intolerant censorship, one of its/methods having been book burning. Although the Christian Church engaged in this labour very early in its history, it turned to the burning of Jewish books for the first time, charging that they were hurtful to Christianity, only in the 13th Century. The event was a direct result of an internal Jewish division. Rabbinic opponents of Maimonides in the year 1233 presented his writings to monks in Montpelier in South France as containing heretical passages. The monks did not delay to report this the papal representative locally, and the latter hastened to order the public burning of all copies of "Guide to the Perplexed" and the "Book of Knowledge" of Maimonides which were found in the region. A similar fate befell his books in Paris.

This was an ominous precedent. Seven years passed, and on the basis of complaints made by a converted Jew in Paris that the Talmud contained 35 serious attacks upon Christianity, Pope Gregory ordered a public debate, the first of its kind, between Jews and Christians concerning the accusations against the Talmud. There is no need to elaborate that in the debate (in which the prosecutors and the judges were representatives of the Church) the defeat of the Jews was "guaranteed" ahead of time. In 1242 24 wagon loads containing thousands of copies of the Talmud were cast into the huge fires that raged in the streets of Paris. Rabbi Meir of Rottenberg was an eyewitness to the event, and composed the well-known lament: "O THOU BURNT (MORE)

WITH FIRE, PRAY FOR THE HEACE OF THY MOURNERS" (which is one of the laments for the Ninth Day of Av). The kindling of fires for the burning of books of the Talmud continued another five centuries, the last being in Poland in 1757, and became a part of the Jewish martyrology.

Except for one incident, bookburning by Jews is unknown. The sole incident stemmed from the conflict between the Hassidim and their Opponents (Mitnagdim) toward the end of the 18th Century. In Vilna there was a public burning of Hassidic literature. As is well known, this did not stop the development and expansion of the Hassidic movement, even as the burning of the Talmud was unable to cripple the spirit of Judaism. It would appear that this way of book burning can destroy the material upon which human thought is inscribed, but is incapable of suppressing that thought.

Book burning—of Jews and others—was revived in the 20th Century by the German Nazis. In his book, "The Rise and Fall of the Third Reich," William Shirer wrote: "On the evening of the 10th May 1933, some 4½ months after Hitler was made Chancellor; there took place in Berlin an event the like of which had not been seen in the Western world since the Middle Ages. Close to midnight a torchlight procession of thousands of students in the square of Unter Den Linden facing the University of Berlin came to a close. A huge pile of books which had been assembled there was set on fire by torches, and while the flames lapped them up, more and more books were thrown into the bonfire until some 20,000 books were consumed by the fire. Similar events took place in several other cities. The book burnings had begun." (There follows a quotation of Nazi justification of the event.)

As far as is known, Christian missionary activity does not win much support among the Jewish citizens of the country, and the prospects of its success among them cannot cause serious concern to any intelligent person. The associations stirred by the possibility that in Israel books will be set aftire are so appalling that it is hard to believe that those who publicly announced this plan really were in earnest. If, nevertheless, there are among us hotheads who really intend to implement such an idiotic idea, we can only hope that there is someone who can put a stop to it in time. END ARTICLE

SUBJECT NUMBER TWO: SECTARIANS

DATE: 14.2.80 JOURNAL: "IETZE NAYIS" (TELAW V) YIDDISH LANGUAGE NEWS FEATURE HEADING: "THE SECT OF EMMA HERGER AROUND ZICRON YAACOV"

QUOTE: It is quite an old precept among us Jews: "AND THE LAND SHALL NOT HE SOLD IN HERPETUITY". Essentially this precept is based upon social foundations. The intent is quite simple. It was instituted in order to prevent land monopolies, to make in impossible the formation of a certain class of owners of large tracts of land who would be obliged to hire workers to cultivate them waxxx they will be unable to do it themselves. The workers in the course of time will become embroiled in a class of servitude and exploitation. On the other hand, the precept also bore a national character, the aim being the prevention of sale to foreigners who might thereby have control over the land of the state of Israel. The strangers may come with the bestand holiest intentions, they may just be angels, even messengers from Messiah son of David, yet it is forbidden to sell them any land.

From of old our poor little country has held a kind of magnetism to alien eyes, always there was this desire to buy us up, or to take our land away, to rend it from us by force. It isn't necessary to present evidence from historical facts and to prove this proposition.

It is a matter of years now since a German woman by name of Emma Berger has bought up around Zicron Yaacov a considerable section of land upon which to set up structures and plants. She is not the proprietor, which means that she deals with the property for the benefit of a sect which calls itself "Beth-El." The name alone smells of evangelism. Residents from that area tell of seeing buses driving around of various sizes, including one bus which gathers students and workers to bring them to the colony, the workers to their work and the children to their studies. Inscribed on the vehicles is the name "BETHEL". The language which is heard among them in the colony is for the most part German. The sect has at its disposal a large area of pro perties among hundreds of dunams land, and as it appears, buildings have been erected for industrial purposes. It is known that they produce noodles, bread and-aluminium ware. The entrances are shut tight, the work carried out behind closed windows....

When journalists have tried to photograph these places, they have not been permitted. Recently, they have begun to put up additional buildings. Among the construction workers are members of the sect as well as hired hands. One of the Arab workers has said that they work like horses. While they work, they neither eat nor drink. A young man from Canada, dressed in the same work clothes as the others of the sect, stated: "We are building here Kibbutz Bethel." Immediately, someone called him urgently to return to the house. A neighbour has said that these are the only neighbours in the vicinity, they are nice people, but more than a greeting "Shalon" she hasn't heard from them. The woman relates that they are (orderly) people, conduct themselves according to a strict discipline and routin; but they avoid any contact with the surrounding residents. Similarly, another neighbour related that some one told her: "When Messiah comes, we alone will be on the land and not the Jews."

The legal status of the members of the sect is that of temporary residents. The various groups which come there from time to time from abroad, including America and Canada, receive the same legal status from the Interior Ministry. As is known, Emma Berger recently applied for the rights of permanent residence, but the Interior Ministry rejected the application. A senior official of the Interior Ministry paid a visit to the school and kindergarten, examined all the documents of those present, and was satisfied that there was no illegality related to their presence in the country.

The municipality is also concerned over the expansion of the sect under the leadership of Emma Berger, but as long as they violate no law, nothing can be done. Recently, rumours spread that Arabs also were buying up property in Upper Nazareth, a Jewish settlement overlooking the Christian Arab town of Nazareth. It appears that the Arabs are acting as the Jewish National Fund did. It is not clear where the funds are coming from. Is there any lack of petrodollars? The same question is asked concerning Madame Emma Berger. From whence come her funds to expand her colony or Kibbutz Bethel? It's hard to get an answer

Perhaps if it was known, the aims of this German colony in the heart of the State of Israel would be better understood. END ARTICIE

The reporter was unable to make any direct contact (except for a few moments) with any of the sectarians or to gain access to the properties and lands held by them. She did considerable research and interviewing of lawyers, local officials and government officials, and alleges that a number of their activities are either in violation of laws governing property and management of enterprises or need to be tested in the courts. She also charges that the sect has set up organizations which appear to be distinct from them but are actually coverups for sectarian activity. The reporter views the sect as basically run by shrewd manipulators of religious belief and compares it to similar cults which have sprung up in the wake of end-time anxiety.

WANTS RECOGNITION" (MARCH 9th): THE headline and article are a misrepresentation of Kibbutz Ir Ovot. The term "JEWISH CHRI STIAN" is extremely offensive to me as well as to the members of the kibbutz. Ir Ovot is an Orthodox Jewish kibbutz. Teffilin are put on every morning. We keep the Mitzwot-the Kashrut laws, shnat shmita, etc. No one here holds a belief in Jesus Christ. Benny Morris' information concerning our application to the High Court of Justice is erroreous. We are not demanding government recognition of our "existence," since we have had this since 1977. We are only demanding recognition of the name "Ovot" which has been ours for 15 years. The Interior Ministry has not opposed acknowledgment of our name because of what Morris terms "beliefs," but only because the names committee raised a question as to the actual physical location of the ancient place called Ovot. (END LETTER) BENNY MORRIS COMMENTS: There are Jews Christians at Ir Ovot -- so it is a "Jewish-Christian settlement." It is "Orthodox Jewish" only up to a limit: for example, Orthodox Judaism no longer endorses (MORE)

polygany. Many, if not all, Ir Ovot settlers "believe" -- in some manner -- in Jesus Christ. Pearlmutter, in his announcement of candidacy for the Knesset, stated that he, for one, does so. At the interview, Pearlmutter told me that, while the Jewish Agency had awarded Ir Ovot "recognition" in 1977, the government (i.e. the Ministry of the Interior) had not done so so far. In addition, the Names Committee of that ministry had refused the settlement the name "Ir Ovot"--and the settlement has applied to the High Court on both matters. I never quoted Pearlmutter as saying that it was because of the settlement's beliefs that the committee was withholding recognition, though I am not certain he can know for certain on what besis it has made that refusal. END

A new book by archaeologist and New Testament scholar Bruce E. Schein is bound to produce further intense discussion. In "FOLLOWING THE WAY" (Minneapolis: Augsburg Press, 1980) Schein reproduces an artist's conception of the area north and west of the Temple where the Crucifixion probably occurred. A crucial question has always been the location of the "second wall," while the "first wall" is generally believed to parallel the Old City's David Street, from Jaffa Gate to the Temple Mount. The place of execution by the Romans would be outside the wall, the "second wall", and Schein believes that he has evidence to support his proposal.

Dr. Schein, a longtime Jerusalem resident and a Lutheran, bases the drawing on evidence from the excavation below the Evangelical Lutheran Church of the Redeemer in the Old City. Dr. Ute Mux, director of the German School of Archaeology, directed the dig which revealed quarrying done during the Herodian period 14 metres below the present street level. In contrast, bedrock is reached just $\frac{1}{2}$ -metre below the surface under the adjoining market street on the east. Since the late Kathleen Kenyon's trench nearby also went down 11 metres before it reached ancient material and evidence of quarrying, it is proposed that an extensivequarry may have originally teen in this quarter, with Josephus' "second wall" just above it... Dr. Schein, who assisted Dr. Lux in the excevation under the Lutheran Church, is convinced that the evidence will withs; nd further investigation. Since his book is just being released this month in America, it will be interesting to note other scholars' responses. END

Knight of the United Christian Church (sic:) at a recent public meeting in Jerusalem organized by the Israel Inter-Faith Committee together with the UCCI and the AJC. The topic discussed at the meeting, "HELIGIOUS FREEDOM AND THE LAW," served as an introduction to a planned dialogue between various religious groups in Israel. Prof. Herbert Kerrigan of the University of South California, a member of the Church of Scotland, and the two Jewish speakers, Prof. Itzhak Englard and Dr. Shimon Shetreet, of the Hebrew University, emphasised the application of law, not necessarily religious law, to individual rights.-JCNS

B. ART:- DATE: 21.3.80 JOURNAL: "YEDIOT AKHRONOT" (HEB PM IND) REVIEW HEADING: "FOR CHRISTIAN INFORMATION AT JAFFA GATE"

EXCERPTS: Joseph Yackerson arrived in Israel several years ago from USSR, held a large exhibition at the Jerusalem Theatre and several solo exhibitions additionally. At present he is a resident of Beersheva....Now he is presenting various paintings, six drawings and lithographs. There is no need to stress that a Jewish artist is "permitted" certainly to choose Jesus the Nazarene as a subject for painting. This is part of the freedom of art, even though we still have our complexes about everything connected with the Christian religion. Another matter is the choice of the place (a Catholic Christian institution perhaps of missionary character) and the style of the invitations to the exhibition. These were exclusively in the English language without a single Hebrew letter. Here there is certainly obsequiousness (or fawning), Levantinism and a vulgar and impudent belittling of the Hebrew Language.

The paintings are "dry" and artificial, and suffer from the familiar defects of Yackerson's paintings. The drawings are excellent. Jesus is portrayed in very Jowish character, and various details of his agony are described as though they were continuing to take place in the Old C_ity of today. H_e is surrounded by an apathetic public round about him, a woman in slacks, a crying child, and the cross is there with the wall in the background. The "message" is that the sufferings of Jesus continue—but—we do not sense them. In one of the paintings Jorusalem appears ruined and desolate. (END)
