

Jesus was Jewish and preached almost exclusively to other Jews. Understanding Jesus' first-century Jewish context is essential for understanding and applying theology, here and now.

Taught in English, this course aims to enrich pastors, theologians and all who are curious about Jesus' life as a Jew in the Land He walked.
